The Board are thrilled to announce the appointment of a new principal for Heretaunga College. Fiona Craven, will come to Heretaunga from William Colenso College in Napier where she has been Deputy Principal and Acting Principal over the past 10 years. Fiona will take up her appointment at the start of Term 3 on Monday 22 July 2019.

Eligible families receive a free modem; 30gb of data pre-loaded on a pre-pay service, no fixed contract and can top up as they go through Skinny Mobile. Families work with Library staff to create a Skinny account and learn how to get connected to the modem at home. There is no data cabling required, just plug into a power point and power the modem on!

## NCEA STUDENT APP UPDATE
