HERETAUNGA COLLEGE PROPOSED AMENDMENT TO ENROLMENT SCHEME – HOME ZONE

The Heretaunga College Board of Trustees is in the process of developing an amendment to the current enrolment scheme as directed by the Ministry of Education Under section 11H(1) of the Education Act 1989.

All students who live within the home zone shall be entitled to enrol at the school.

NZQA FEES

NZQA fees of \$76.70 for all senior students are **due to be paid by the 24th August**. This is a standard fee set by NZQA, collected by the school and forwarded to NZQA in September. The fee covers all credits earned this year, both internal and external assessments. If your student is entered for any scholarship exams, there is an extra cost of \$30 per exam.

Fees can be reduced to \$20 per student or \$30 per family if you are on a benefit or have a community services card or your income meets the threshold for a community services card. Please check www.workandincome.govt.nz for threshold levels if you are unsure if you are entitled for assistance. You must apply for financial assistance, if eligible. Forms are available to complete in the school office or you can request one to be sent to you by emailing me at bitchenerl@heretaunga.school.nz.

NEAR MISSES WITH STUDENTS ON TRAIN TRACKS

There have been some near misses recently involving children crossing train tracks before and after school. They all have one thing in common: children aren't expecting a "**second train**". In all of these recent near misses, bells and lights have still been operating, but because the first train has passed, students make the mistake of thinking it's safe to cross. This can be extremely dangerous as the track crossings in areas with double tracks **always** have the potential for a second train to pass.

As well as looking and listening before crossing, please make it clear to children that if bells and lights are going, it's because a second train could be coming and it's **not safe to cross**. 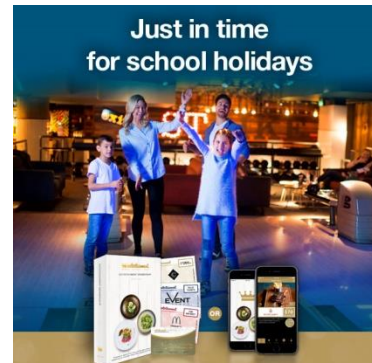

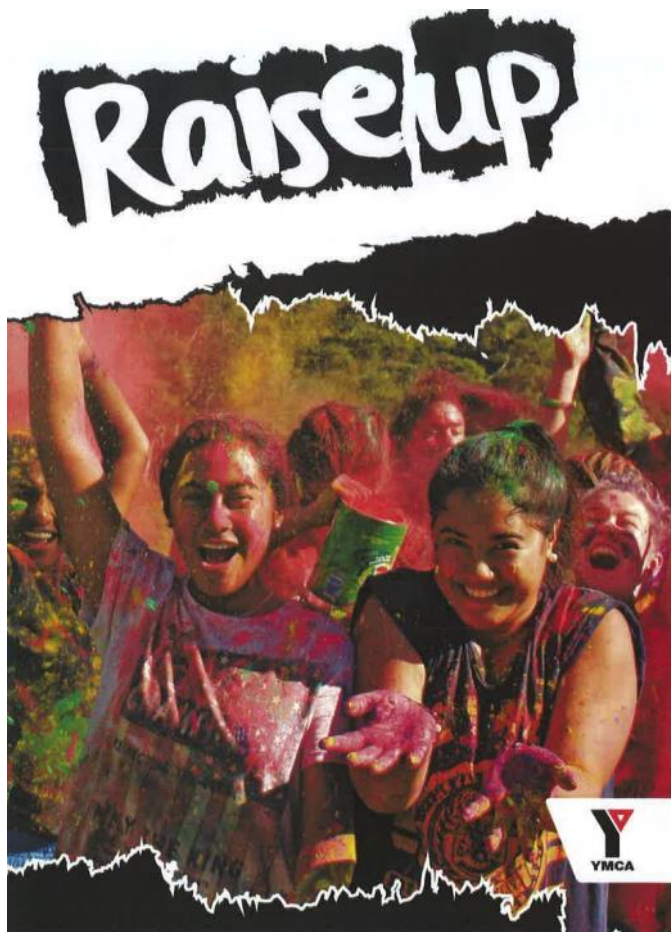
