OPC WINTER EXPERIENCE

On 28 August a group of students, together with Mr Carter, went to the Outdoor Pursuits Centre in the central North Island. The following is an account of this week from a student's perspective.

My Experience at O.P.C. in August, 2017.

When I first arrived at O.P.C. (Hillary Outdoors) on Sunday 27th August, I was nervous and excited. Nervous, because I didn't know what we would be doing on the first day.

When we walked in to Taurewa Lodge, where we were staying, we met our instructor for the week, Seb. He showed us some pictures of what activities we could be doing and we had choices about what we really wanted to do. The first thing we did was to hand in our phones. These were locked away for the whole week so that they wouldn't distract us and so that we could get to know each member of the group of 10 by communicating the old-fashioned way! (not really!).

On the first day, our instructor tested our teamwork and communication. First, we had to pass a small ball around, so that each member of the group touched it. The challenge was to achieve this in under 5 seconds! We finally figured this out after 20 minutes of different attempts, refining these as we went along.

Later on we went caving, and it was so much fun, even though it was pitch black and we had to crawl through some tight shapes like the "panini-maker" and the "corkscrew". We saw lots of glow worms and the group had to navigate our way out of the cave without the instructor.

That night we played spotlight inside the lodge (we were the only group there) and had lots of laughs playing "Marco Polo".



Tuesday saw us hit the slopes early at Whakapapa on Mt. Ruapehu. We spent the whole day learning how to ski or snowboard, and a lot of time on our bums! Wednesday offered us an orienteering challenge, trying to navigate our way through bush and swamps, following a map. Lots of laughs again when Ezra lost his gumboot in the mud and Mr. Carter got stuck while retrieving it! This was followed by a high Flying fox over the valley. I'm terrified of heights, but I managed to do it. Again, I was really scared on the high ropes course, but I still managed to do it because the rest of my group encouraged me.

Thursday saw us white-water rafting on the Tongariro River in 2-person inflatable kayaks. I love white-water rafting, it was so much fun, even though it was a 2-person boat. The overnighter involved paddling across a lake and camping out.

I enjoyed visiting the hot pool on Tuesday evening and playing card games and charades on other evenings, they were so much fun.

Then suddenly, it was Friday afternoon, and we were on our way home again..... I wish I could do something like this again in the future!

Sustainability Trust's Curtain Bank will be based at Timberlea Community Centre from Monday, September 25 to Friday, October 6.

Who can get FREE curtains: Families who have a Community Services Card and don't have adequate curtains can get lined, fitted curtains for the living room - and for the bedrooms of children, the elderly, and sick people as well.

Any Community Services Card holder can get free curtains from the Curtain Bank between March and November, but it can be difficult for people not in Wellington city to access the service. The Curtain Bank brings the service to different communities through the year to extend its reach.



How to get curtains:
To get curtains, just fill out and return a window measurement form. This can be printed from our website or will be available from Timberlea Community Centre, 72 Norana Rd, Upper Hutt between Sept 25 and Oct 6. The centre will be open from noon to 2pm on weekdays. We have also enclosed one form, which you are free to copy. The last day to return the forms to Timberlea Community Centre is October 6.
