## NZQA FEES

If you have still not paid your student's NZQA fees, which are payable for all senior students who gain credits, they now need to be paid **directly to NZQA**. We can no longer accept any payments for NZQA fees here at school. The easiest way for payments of these to be made is online via the student's Learner Login on the NZQA website [www.nzqa.govt.nz](http://www.nzqa.govt.nz). If you are wanting to make a manual payment, the form School Candidate Form-Payment of NZQA Fees must be completed. Copies of this are available on the NZQA website or here at the school office.

If you qualify for financial assistance, the completed form must be handed into the school office but the \$20 payment must be made directly to NZQA.

If NZQA fees are still unpaid after 3rd December, NZQA adds an additional \$50 late fee to the charge.

NZQA will not release student's results if fees are not paid.


