GENERAL INFORMATION

Introduction

Heretaunga College strives to provide a wide variety of enjoyable physical opportunities for our students to participate in. The College actively works in partnership with the local community and relies on assistance from families to provide a programme that meets the needs of the students.

It is encouraged that all Junior Students play at least ONE sport. It may be a winter or summer sport and either participation based or competitive.

Selection or involvement in extra-curricular activities at any level, requires all students to maintain a satisfactory work ethic and standard of behaviour in the classroom. Failure to do so will result in extra-curricular opportunities being restricted.

Students wishing to play sport for the College must register and pay the appropriate fees. Fundraising is required for tournaments to help reduce the costs to players. Sport at Heretaunga, like other Colleges, relies on parents, staff, and students to coach and manage teams. Volunteering in sport is a rewarding experience that brings the school and community together.

Registration

The process for sports registration at Heretaunga College is detailed below:

- 1. **Choose** the sports you want to play.
- 2. **Check** it does not clash with any other commitments.
- 3. **Think** for competitive teams do you have time to attend training and matches.
- 4. **Ask** whoever pays the fees if it's ok to pay.
- 5. **Register** by asking your parent or caregiver to follow the registration process on SchoolBridge.
- 6. Payments can be made at the school office or online.

Registrations due

Registration deadlines for all weekly sports are:

Summer sports (Term 1)	Monday 5 February 2024
Winter sports (Terms 2 & 3)	Friday 8th March 2024
Summer sports (Term 4)	TBA in term 3 2024

This is so we can find coaches and managers for teams and register the teams with College Sport Wellington.

For **one off events** if you have expressed an interest, you will receive an email within a month of the event confirming final details and seeking commitment.

Please note that all dates detailed in this booklet are those outlined at the time of issue, December 2023. Some changes may occur due to unforeseen circumstances, for example COVID 19 disruption or weather events.

Fees and payments

Sports registration fees are required to pay for the costs involved in sport. In general, the fees are used to pay College Sport Wellington registration fee, uniform replacement, transport in the school van and essential equipment. All costs are kept to a minimum. The College is aware that some families have financial difficulties from time to time and we do not wish to disadvantage any student wishing to play sport. If there are any students with financial difficulties, please contact the Sports Co-ordinator in confidence.

Pay before you play

The school has a strict no pay no play policy. Registration fees for a sport or activity must be paid before a student can be involved. Payment of the sports fees can be made on a payment plan; to arrange a payment plan you will need to make contact with our accounts team on accounts@heretaunga.school.nz.

Refunds

All refund requests will only be considered by a written application to the Sports Co-ordinator on a case-by-case basis.

Any refunds granted will be less **\$10** administration fee and any other costs that may be incurred due to the withdrawal. All refunds will be credited to the student's school account. This may be used in the first instance to offset any other outstanding co-curricular or curriculum fees or costs. If there are no outstanding fees or costs, any refunds will be returned by cheque or deposited to a nominated bank account. A full refund will be made if the Sports Co-ordinator cannot place a student into a team or a sport.

Refunds will not be made:

- If a student withdraws without notification to the Sports Co-ordinator after they have been placed in a team
- 2. If a student leaves school, is excluded / expelled or stood down during the season.
- 3. If a student is banned from a sport due to conduct or misbehaviour.
- 4. If a student withdraws due to over-commitment once the season has started.
- 5. If a student gains employment during the season and is no longer able to play.
- 6. If a student changes their mind and does not want to play anymore.

Student uniform

In most cases students will be issued with a uniform to be returned at the end of the playing season for the sport. In some cases, students will need to wear their PE uniform or a particular code specific uniform. This will be confirmed with the team selection details circulated prior to the first sports fixtures.

Contract

Students are asked to sign a uniform contract and parents / caregivers are asked to support students in looking after items loaned to them.

- 1. I will look after the uniform that has been loaned to me and record the item number/code.
- 2. I will NOT swap my uniform with anyone else.
- 3. If I need to swap my uniform, I will return it to the Sports Co-ordinator.
- 4. I will return my uniform to the Office within 7 days after my last game.
- 5. I must wear my uniform for all my games and will wear it with PRIDE.
- 6. I will return my uniform washed.
- 7. If I damage or lose my uniform, I will have to pay the replacement cost.
- 8. I will not wear my sports uniform during school hours.

Sports available at Heretaunga College

At Heretaunga College we try to cater for all abilities. Sports are offered in two ways:

- 1. Sports played in a weekly basis normally arranged by College Sport Wellington (Weekly sports on page 6)
- 2. One-off sports events/tournaments arranged through College Sport Wellington and longer tournaments such as those arranged by regional sporting bodies such as Winter Tournament (One-off sports on pages 24-26).

We can offer competitive and social opportunities based on how the student wishes to participate in sport. We encourage students to play sport with their friends and be involved in team management for social sport. Sport is good for people in many ways; some for competitive challenge and others for the fitness and the social benefits it provides.

Volunteer support

Code of Behaviour

Players Code

- 1. Play to the best of your ability, but within the rules of the game
- 2. Recognise and respect the abilities and disabilities of others both teammates and opponents
- 3. Accept the officials' decision without gesture or argument
- 4. Represent your school with pride and privilege
- 5. Be humble in victory and gracious in defeat
- 6. Support the coaches and their requests of you
- 7. Thank the coach, officials, opponents, and supporters

Coaches / Managers Code

- Set positive and appropriate guidelines and behavioural standards for yourself and your athletes on and off the playing arena. This includes refraining from swearing and making any inappropriate comments or gestures
- 2. Sets high standards and promotes the need for punctuality, discipline and commitment
- 3. Take responsibility for your players conduct both on and off the playing arena
- 4. Instil a sense of pride and respect in players performance
- 5. Treat all players, including the opposition, with dignity and respect
- 6. Demonstrate positive examples of sportsmanship at all times
- 7. Respect and accept the judgement and decisions of officials without remonstration

Parents Code

- 1. Positively encourage and support the efforts of all players
- 2. Make an effort to understand the rules of the game
- 3. Refrain from any criticism or abuse directed at officials
- 4. Put an emphasis on genuine effort ahead of victory and encourage players to accept the outcomes of all games, irrespective of the result
- 5. Recognise good play by either team and never ridicule an individual player in either team
- 6. Ensure the use of any form of violence is actively discouraged
