### UNIFORM

As you are aware, Heretaunga College is a uniform school. When students are persistent in wearing their uniform incorrectly, we view this as disrespect for the mana of our school and community.

The school holidays are the best opportunity for caregivers to ensure that students' uniforms are completely sorted before returning to school in term 4. This includes making sure that hair, jewellery and piercings meet the school uniform expectations as outlined in the student and caregiver handbooks.

As of term 4, students will not be permitted into classes with incorrect uniform. Students will no longer be issued with a permit for non-uniform items. Students who arrive at school without correct uniform will be provided with clean uniform items to borrow for the day.

For a medical exemption, students are to bring a medical certificate and will be provided with a permit.

As of term 4, our new school hoodie will be available for purchase from the school office as detailed in this newsletter. Therefore no other hoodie (including the HC sport hoodie) is viewed as part of the HC uniform.

Correct uniform wearing by students at our school demonstrates their respect for the school and our PRIDE values.

## OUTDOOR PURSUITS CENTRE TRIP

On the 9th of August, ten senior students from Heretaunga College and our accompanying teacher, Mr Carter, bundled into the school van and road tripped up to the Hillary Outdoors Centre, at the base of Mt Tongariro. We would be spending five action-filled days climbing, hiking, and sliding around snow-covered slopes, deep cave systems and an impressive on-site high ropes course, during our stay at the Outdoor Education Centre. Our entourage consisted of three year thirteen students, Emma, Ellie, and Morgan; and seven year twelve students; Fraser, Will, James, Lyric, Erin, Amy, and Portia. Every minute we experienced on this trip was incredible, and we feel very lucky to have had this opportunity to explore the outdoors in the amazing ways we did. We would like to tell you about some of the memories we made on our week out, and we hope that we can impress upon you just how amazing our experience was!

Our adventure started by travelling to Hillary Outdoors Education Centre (O.P.C.). We had time to get to know each other on the way and jam to music. Once we arrived, we were shown our cabins (which were called chalets) and we then set up our new home for the rest of the time we were there.

The next day, which was officially day one of OPC, we packed our gear and headed up Mt Ruapehu. We walked up part of the mountain and found a place to eat lunch and slide down a snow slope for fun, while also learning to use our ice axes to stop ourselves from sliding too far. This is called self-arresting, a technique that mountain climbers use to control their speed when they slide down steep slopes. The views were spectacular looking down the mountain. Then the rest of the day we chilled out back at the Hillary Centre, getting used to the site.

We started out day two with a short walk to the on-site low rope course, where we did team building. We thought that was hard until we had to do the high ropes course next door, and that certainly challenged us. The high ropes course included a trapeze, platform to platform jumping, rope climbing and the centipede climb, which was essentially a free-hanging suspended pole that you had to climb up. Later that day, we headed to Hillary Outdoors' very own flying fox which was very fun for everyone, as you would stop halfway across a river and then be dragged back to land by the group. After the day's activities, we headed back to our chalets where we made new friends with the cabin of people from another high school next door.

On day three, we loaded up the van with caving equipment and set out into the scrubland around the level area of Tongariro National Park. We came to a cave entrance next to a river and proceeded to climb down into the depths of the cave, to where we found bioluminescent glow worms, ancient shiny calcium deposits, and fossilised shells embedded in the cave walls. There were many places where we would need to crawl through gaps barely wider than our shoulders, flat on our stomachs. We spent several hours in the dry cave, exploring all the trickiest and most challenging routes, then we spent another half hour in a separate water cave. The water cave had a freezing cold stream running into its mouth, and about five minutes in, a sharp left turn in the stream had carved a low ceilinged cave no more than 50 centimetres high with the river flowing through it. We had to crawl through this tiny fissure to make it to the other side. We all attempted to pass through but only some of us managed to get all the way through. It was an exhilarating experience.

Day four was the first day of our overnight adventure. We packed our packs full of overnight gear: food, tents, a gas cooker, and rock climbing gear and the warmest clothes we had. We hopped in the van and set out towards Whakapapa ski field. We parked at the ski field car park and walked underneath the gondola to the side of the mountain where we would be setting up our rock climbing gear on a pre-placed carabiner in the cliff face. We tramped down to this spot from the ski slopes, over the snow and rock. We set up the pulley system on the cliff in three places, so we had three groups of us climbing up different sections of the cliff. The views were spectacular and we were already so high up, but at the top of the cliff, you could see for miles, including the snow-capped Mt. Ngauruhoe. In the afternoon, we tramped further down the mountain below the snow line and set up the tents on a sheltered ridge above the river for the night.

Finally, it was our last day of OPC, we woke to the sound of Mr Carter's voice outside the tents, trying to wake us up. Sadly, the heat we built up in our sleeping bags overnight was going to disappear as we went outside. The wind had blown a frost from the mountain that had settled on the ground around us. After having noodles for breakfast which tasted interesting, we packed up our gear and looked at the map. We then headed to the top of the ridge where we walked our way down the mountain, stopping to have breaks and admire the beautiful views. Sadly, it was time to pack up and say our goodbyes, then on the road again to jam to music all the way home.

This was an amazing and life-changing experience for every one that went. We all learned to work together, manage ourselves, adapt to the environment, make decisions, and lead our peers. We all experienced new challenges, made friends and did things we never thought we would do. All of us definitely recommend trying the OPC experience for yourselves! It's something we will never forget.

We are really thankful to everyone that helped make our adventure happen! Especially Mr Carter for coming along with us, keeping us organised and driving the van; and Karl for being an amazing instructor.

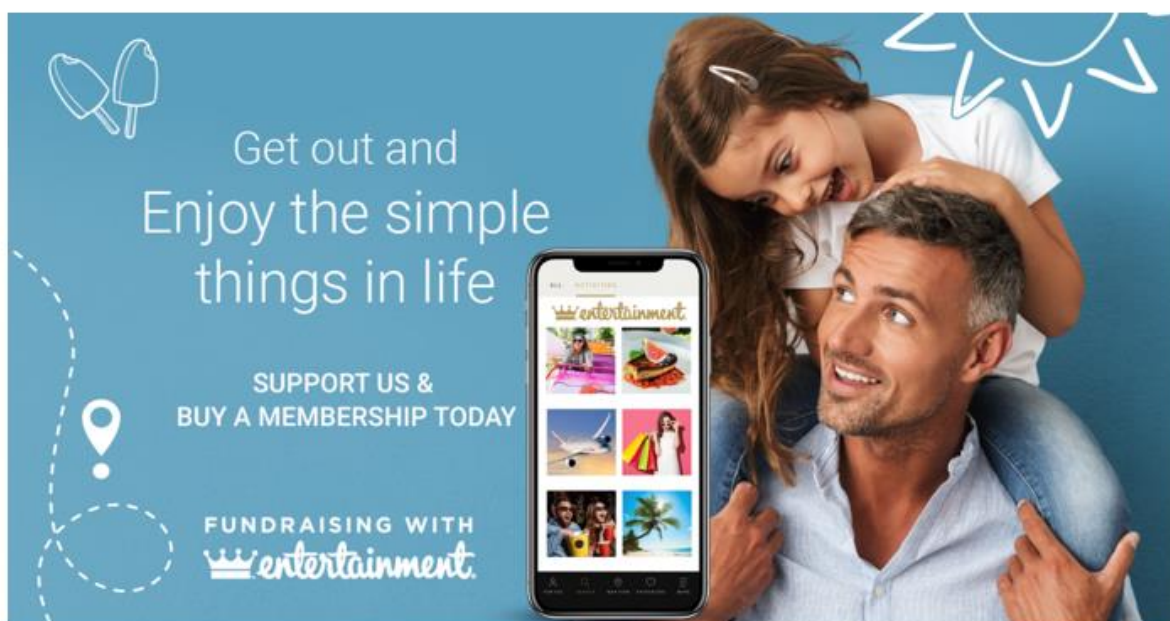
