

We are super grateful to Upper Hutt Hire who donated the fencing, to the Mad Butcher for donating sausages to feed us, to the Mint Food Truck for their kai and to former HC student Amir for doing the 'chop the mop.' We also want to thank the Community Committee for their work too, and the other students who chipped in - you all rule! Finally, thanks-wise, we would like to shout out to Mandy, Christobel, John and Tom from the Cancer Society for their support, and to Mr Douglas for making the magic happen.

It was great too to have some laps of remembrance for Ms Massam and Caitlin Kerr, with their songs 'Don't Stop Believin' and 'Gimme, Gimme, Gimme' (even though Mr Douglas struggled as the DJ during this time). And, although the students talked a big game before the event, the teachers' baton did not stop moving the whole time, with Mr Pike walking for almost 12 hours!

Like the students, these staff are amazing - Michelle, Matthew, Julie and Amy raised between \$850 and \$1,700 each. We all know that teachers and teacher aides are not paid enough, so massive props to you. But we want to pay a special tribute to Mary Mooring who raised \$4,331 - she is the highest fundraiser in the Wellington region.

We are proud that we are at the moment the second highest fundraising team in New Zealand, and our school can't wait to be a part of the event in 2023!


In term 3 we will be running fun sports sessions during morning break in the Sports Centre on Mondays, Tuesdays and Wednesdays;
