A Top Scholar award is given to the best performing student in that subject in New Zealand. For 2020 we are delighted and extremely proud to have Heretaunga's very first Top Scholar Award for Painting.

Isla Ashby has been one of our top arts students since Year 10, when she was awarded the Top Junior Art Student. She then went on to attain Excellence in Level 1, Merit in Level 2 and now Top Scholar in Level 3 for Painting. Her creative skills were also evident and rewarded in fashion: in 2019 she was awarded a new prize established in each school by the Prime Minister, recognising excellence in a vocational subject: Isla was awarded this prize at Heretaunga for Fashion.

We all know what 2020 meant to our students at Heretaunga College. And yet despite those challenges our students demonstrated superb resilience and endurance and of course kindness to one another. Isla's achievement is even more special because it was achieved under these strange and unexpected conditions.

Renew your child concession before it expires on February 28



Discounted child fares for students aged 16+ expire on 28th February 2021.

Aged 16+

If you - or your children - are aged 16+, are using a red Snapper card and are enrolled in full-time secondary education, then it's time to renew those child concessions. The good news is you only need to do this annually by 28th February in order to enjoy discounted fares all year round.

Under 16 years of age

If you – or your children – have bought a new Red Snapper and are under 16 years of age, you will need to apply for a one-off concession on your Snapper. This will be set to expire on 28th February after you have turned 16.

Renewing your concession online?

You can renew your concession online using our online application form. Alternatively, get in touch with us by emailing concessions@snapper.co.nz and include the following:

Your 16-digit Snapper card number (you can find this on the back of your Snapper card)

The email address your Snapper card is registered to

Proof of enrolment (one of the following):

A scanned copy of a valid School ID

A copy of a letter of enrolment including your name and date of birth for the 2021 year

A copy of your current timetable displaying your name and date of birth for the 2021 year

Renewing your concession in person?

Drop in to see either the Wellington or Upper Hutt i-SITE team with your Snapper card and proof of enrolment (one of the following):

A copy of a valid School ID

A letter of enrolment including your name and date of birth for the 2021 year

A copy of your current timetable displaying your name and date of birth for the 2021 year.

How do I know whether my child concession is working?

When you tag-on the bus, listen for the beeps: if you hear two beeps, then you have been charged a child fare, the Snapper card reader will also display the word "Child" on the screen.

You can also check online by logging into your Snapper account, provided the card is registered. You will see 'Concession type: child' under the card number if the concession is active.

If you've already applied for a child concession, it's been more than 2 working days and you're still being charged an adult fare, please get in touch with us so we can help sort things out for you:

Log into your Snapper account on our website

Select Get Help from the options on the right-hand side, next to your card

Select 'Something else' then 'Missing concession' from the options provided

What if I'm not returning to school?

If you're not returning to secondary school in the Wellington region in 2021 you don't need to do anything: your child concession will expire on 28th February 2021 and you'll be charged the adult fare next time you tag-on the bus.

What if I'm off to university?

If you're enrolling in tertiary education this year, you may be eligible for a tertiary concession. Check out the Metlink website for more information and eligibility criteria.

Metlink works with approved Tertiary Education Organisations to contact students via email, to explain how to apply for a Tertiary Concession online.

If you do not receive an email, then as long as you belong to one of the above approved Tertiary Education Organisations, you can simply apply for a tertiary concession online.



It is skillfully constructed to create and build experience and the emotional language which aids the development of the emergent young man and enhances the role of the father/mentor.

When a boy is recognised as a young adult through the rite of passage framework, he can begin to practice all the relationship strategies that will serve him well as a man when he finally leaves the parental environment – qualities such as respectful behaviour, trustworthiness, responsibility, and honouring one's word.

A parallel programme supports mothers to meet their son anew as they transition home and beyond into adulthood.
