The Innovative Young Minds (IYM) programme is a week-long residential programme for female Year 11 and Year 12 students that runs during the July school holidays. The programme is designed to encourage young women to explore science, technology, engineering, mathematics and high-tech manufacturing – fields known as the STEMM sector.

The selection process was very competitive. Being selected means that Holly will be able to explore some of the diverse study and career opportunities in science and technology, and talk with amazing women leaders and innovators about their own experiences in science and tech.

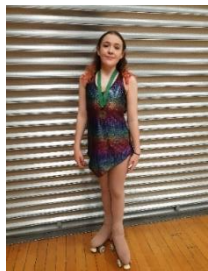

Eligible families receive a free modem; 30gb of data pre-loaded on a pre-pay service, no fixed contract and can top up as they go through Skinny Mobile. 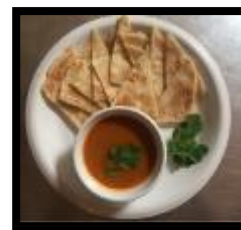

NCEA STUDENT APP UPDATE

The NCEA Student App can now be downloaded from either the Apple App Store or Google Play Store. It is available to use in English and Te Reo Maori, is free to download and can be used from any smart device.

This version displays and better supports multiple levels of NCEA and new users can simply add credits from previous years without having to also add standards information first. This means that students can track their progress towards various NCEA levels over multiple calendar years more quickly and easily. The App allows students to plan, select and set their NCEA credit goals and targets and to see how they are tracking towards NCEA Levels One, Two and Three, including Literacy, Numeracy and University Entrance.

Black Bean Brownie:

I have fooled even the toughest of critics with this recipe - DELICIOUS!!! And very chocolatey.

Ingredients:

- 1 400g Can of Black Beans
- 2 Tbsp. Cacao Powder
- ½ Cup Oats
- 1/3 Cup Maple Syrup – Make sure it's pure!
- ¼ Cup Melted Coconut Oil
- 2 tsps. Vanilla Extract/Essence
- 2 Tbsp. Chia Seeds
- ½ tsp. Baking Powder
- ¾ Cup Dark Chocolate Chips (this is very rich, tone it down if you're not that into a deliciously gooey chocolatey brownie).



Method:

Heat oven to bake at 180°C.

Put all ingredients into a food processor except for the chocolate chips and blend until you get a smoother texture (you don't want NO lumps though). Fold through the chocolate chips and then spread onto a non-stick baking tray.

Bake for 20 minutes and then leave to cool before removing slice from the tray.

It can be easier to put the tray in the fridge once cool enough to do so, before slicing.

Store in an air tight container in the fridge.



Nourish Me Style Shepherd's Pie

This one pot wonder is a great take on the traditional Shepherd's pie but is jam packed with WAAAY more vegetables, and less dairy.

For this mince part:

- 1kg premium beef mince
- 1 cup beef stock
- 2 diced onions
- 2 large carrots - grated
- 2 cups diced mushrooms
- 2 diced capsicums
- 125g spinach
- 3 Tbsp. Worcestershire sauce
- 3 Tbsp. Tomato paste
- 1 Tbsp. Crushed Garlic
- 1 tsp. Mixed Herbs (dried)



Fry the onions in a wok with the Worcestershire sauce. Add all other vegetables and stock. Let simmer until vegetables are half cooked. Add mince and remaining ingredients and let simmer until cooked through and minimal liquid remains.

For the mash:

- 6 medium peeled potatoes - diced
- 1/2 a small pumpkin - diced (about 3 cups)

Boil the potatoes and pumpkin until soft enough to mash. Drain water and mash - no need to add milk!

Putting it together:

Heat up your oven to 180C, on bake.

Spread the mince dish evenly in a baking dish, top with the mash.

Bake for 20-30 minutes or until slightly browned.

Meaningful activities are arranged for guests, such as fishing, sewing, developing computer skills, and our newest venture our garden, Tupaia. Tupaia provides us with fresh produce for the Soup Kitchen, as well as an ongoing connection, community and a place for people to stand – somewhere they belong and are treated with respect. These meaningful activities are important as they give a sense of community and purpose.

The Compassion Soup Kitchen has been looking after the marginalised in Wellington since 1901. Everyone is welcome in the community and no one is turned away, regardless of their circumstance.
